An interview with Warwick Cheney by Di Gardner - DVAS Bulletin - September 25

Warwick joined the Diamond Valley Arts Society on 3st March 1982 when we occupied 2 rooms at the Greensborough Primary School in Grimshaw St. Greensborough.

He trained as a fitter and turner then took up teaching Secondary level year 7-12 Apprentices Fitting Machinery in 1974 at Coburg Tech, Keon Park Tech, Peter Lalor Tech and finally at Mill Park Secondary School. He also taught Graphics that included Technical drawing and later Graphic Design. Although he didn't teach art back then he was interested. He said as a teacher work is visual. Warwick challenged his students with what could they do or change to make it better and of course it was up to them. That always flowed into my own work, what could I do to make it better.

Warwick joined the DVAS committee and served as a hard working committee member for 15 years including a 3 year term as president and 7 years as vice president. He was part of the team who negotiated the move to Greensborough Secondary College because the Greensborough primary school principal wanted their rooms back. The moving negotiations involved the Banyule council and the Education Department, 15–20 DVAS members would turn up to council meetings to help influence their decision. After successful negotiations the Education Department gave \$35,000 and Banyule Council gave \$35,000 towards the move and new setup.

Once DVAS was at Greensborough Secondary College Warwick helped out with the necessary renovations especially to room 1 that needed walls moved, floors sanded and putting up rails and more. It was a great time and everyone shared the work

Warwick and is wife Barbara travel in their caravan on holidays all over Australia and he said as an artist he was always looking at colours and composition. Although he never painted while he was away he took many photos and fascinating videos often painting from those once home. Often he would combine 2 photos together. In his painting 'Night time at Emerald Station' (above) 2 friends were sitting there in puffer jackets so I changed it putting singlets on them instead.

He is a traditionalist painter loving strong colours in a way that catches light and really loves to take on a challenge e.g. rocks under water or catching the night time light and shadows. 'I only paint in oils, I tried watercolour but there was too much thinking involved' lol.





He organised paint outs for quite a time which everyone enjoyed.

He was Thursday night workshop co coordinator at Greensborough Secondary College for many years and the students remember vividly the fun and laughter that was had. Before every Christmas Warwick would have a competition or a fun game organised. One year the whole class participated in a painting of Marilyn Munro and it was great fun watching her change as each person added their bit. When it was finished it was proudly displayed up on a cupboard at the front of the room.

He says when the class resumed after the short Christmas break Marilyn was nowhere to be found. She was eventually found under papers in a cupboard at the back of the room. We took her out and put her back up on the cupboard at the front of the room. Each week they would come in and she would be missing. One week a bit down the track she couldn't be found anywhere. After quite some time she was found down behind a cupboard. After a lot of investigating we found out that Alan Chawner really disliked her and would hide her every week. Eventually she just totally disappeared so the game was over but it took quite a few weeks of hide and seek for that to happen.

Warwick usually painted a very large and (usually long) painting, sometimes made up of panels or he stretched canvas onto a new frame to make his own size. He said he does them big because they take a long time to do and are more involved.



It's a journey until the painting is finished. He only painted on Thursday nights, his relaxation time and time out. His paintings were usually too big to take home in his car so they 'lived in' at the rooms until finished. Now he paints a size that fits into his car and he still paints 2 hours a week.

PAINTING TIPS & TRICKS!! ~ DID YOU KNOW?

GELATINE PLATE PRINTMAKING RECIPE:

You can make your own Gelatine Plate for Gelli Printing. Here is the link to the 'Gelatine Plate Printmaking Recipe': https://kimherringe.com.au/printmaking/gelatin-plate-printmaking-recipe/

Another highly effective and artist favoured gelatine plate printmaking recipe, designed for durability, reusability, and excellent print quality. This recipe strikes a balance between flexibility and firmness, allowing you to use it for mono-printing techniques without it cracking or drying too fast.

INGREDIENTS

- Unflavoured gelatine powder: 100grams (about 10 standard 7g packets)
- Glycerine (vegetable): 300ml (acts as a plasticizer and preservative)
- Water: 600ml (distilled is ideal)
- Optional: A few drops of essential oil (lavender or tea tree) to inhibit mould

INSTRUCTIONS

Bloom the gelatine:

- Sprinkle the gelatine over **300ml of cold water** in a large bowl.
- Let it sit for 10–15 minutes until it absorbs the water and swells.

Heat the glycerine and remaining water:

- In a separate saucepan, heat 300ml glycerine and 300ml water over medium heat.
- Stir gently and heat until just before boiling.

Combine & dissolve:

- Pour the hot glycerine/water mixture into the bloomed gelatine.
- Stir slowly until all gelatine is fully dissolved and the mixture is smooth.
- Skim off any foam or bubbles from the surface.

Pour into molds:

- Use a shallow tray, baking dish, or acrylic frame as a mold (Aim for approximately 1.3cms to 1.9cms thick (½ to ¾ inch).
- Lightly oil the tray if you want easier removal.
- Let sit at room temperature for 30 minutes, then refrigerate for 4–6 hours (or overnight).

Unmold (optional):

- Carefully run a plastic spatula around the edges and peel out the plate.
- Place it on a clean plexiglass or acrylic sheet for printing.

Storage & Care:

- Store covered in a cool, dry place (not in the fridge, unless your climate is very hot/humid).
- Wrap in plastic wrap or keep in a lidded container.
- If it becomes nicked, gently reheat and remold.
- Clean with a damp sponge (no soap).

Tips for Best Results:

- Use open acrylics or slow-drying paints for longer working time.
- Keep plate clean and moist between sessions.
- Do not freeze it will crack.
- If you see mould, you can reheat the plate, skim off the top layer, and reset it.

TO CHANGE OIL PAINTS TO WATER-BASED OILS, YOU CAN USE THE FOLLOWING METHODS:

- * Use innovative oils made with a modified oil binder that allows them to be thinned and cleaned up with water.
- * Use a low-odour paint additive like **Schmincke Medium W** to transform traditional oil paints into water-mixable oils.

This effect may be more or less pronounced, depending on the colour of the oil and the amount of water you add for thinning. The darker the oil paint and the more water added, the lighter in hue the wet paint film will appear. However, rest assured that all colours will be restored to their original brilliance once dry.

Velvet soap is affordable and readily available at any supermarket. Warwick Cheney, has shared this brush cleaning tip with us:

- dry your brush with paper towel or a rag,
- gently wring out your brushes,
- ♦ let the brush dry,

- ♦ clean your brush in warm water with the velvet soap,
- ♦ shake and mold the brush to shape,
- your brush is good as new and ready for use.

I use this, and it works well. This product is affordable and available at Bunnings Hardware and other hardware stores. 'Diggers Paint Cleanup' is: Biodegradable, Low odour, Non-flammable and Water Based. It cleans and conditions paint brushes and rollers after use, removing both oil and water based paints. It can also be used to clean fresh paint spills from hard surfaces, textiles and carpet. As an added bonus, it conditions equipment – leaving bristles soft and in great shape for your next project!

'OLIVE OIL' & 'OLIVE OIL SOAP' A PAINT BRUSH CLEANER & CONDITIONER FOR OIL PAINTS:

Olive oil and Olive Oil Soap will clean oil paint off your brush and condition it too. Just use paper towel or a rag to clean the oil paint off your brush after dipping it into a little oil or follow the same tip for 'Velvet Soap' above, if you're using Olive Oil Soap.

"WHY DO SOME ARTISTS SPRAY THE BACK OF A CANVAS WITH WATER BEFORE PAINTING?"

Misting or Wetting the back of a primed canvas with water before painting with acrylic paints:

- Misting makes the canvas surface taut, removes dents or pressure spots.
- A taut, canvas should sound like a drum when you tap on it.
- Wetting the canvas, moistens the front of the canvas enough to keep acrylic paint wet but not dripping, workable for longer and the acrylic paint blends easier.

ENTRY FORMS, FEES & GENERAL INFORMATION:

- Members must complete entry forms and pay the entry fee to the Treasurer, prior to submitting forms to the Art Show Sub-Committee. (Refer to entry forms for further details).
 - The HAS Art Show Sub-committee reserves the right to accept or reject artwork & craftwork.
- All entries must be the original work of the artist.
- All artworks must include the following details on the back: (We suggest you print as neatly as possible)
 - Title of artwork.

Medium.

• Size of artwork/frame. (optional)

Price.

- Artist name, contact phone number, email and/or website.
- Corrections on labels by over-writing of striking out price or words is **not** acceptable.


PLEASE NOTE: Thin canvas paintings will not be accepted for hanging, they must be either framed or entered as unframed artworks.

GALLERY/DEEP CANVAS & FRAMED ARTWORKS:


- Paintings must be properly framed and ready to hang with **D-rings** and wire. Staples and cord are **not** accepted.
- The **D-rings** should be approximately **one third down from the top of the frame**. (Refer: Image below)
- The wire should have enough slack to finish 3cms 4cms (1-2 inches) from the top of the frame.

- We recommend the wire ends be covered with tape to prevent injury when handling paintings.
- We recommend you place felt protector pads on the back of artworks to reduce any marks on walls.
- Frames must be cleaned thoroughly and any scratches or defects should be fixed prior to inserting your artwork. Perhaps the frame might need to be repainted? If so, spray paints work a treat.
- Frames with glass must be cleaned on the inside and outside before inserting artwork.
- Artworks must have a HAS card label attached on the back of the frame. The card should clearly show the title, medium, artists name and price. (We suggest you print as neatly as possible).

UNFRAMED ARTWORKS:

- Unframed works (boards, canvas, paper, prints) should be totally covered with clear cellophane. There should be no gaps on the back of the artwork.
- All art/craftworks should have the title, price and artists details on the back.
- Tape securing the cellophane should not be taped onto the original painting, print or card.
- Prints must be clearly labelled 'PRINT OF ORIGINAL ARTWORK' or 'LIMITED EDITION **PRINT OF ORIGINAL ARTWORK**' whichever is applicable, on the back of the artwork.
- All unframed artworks on paper, **must have a backing board** to prevent creasing or damage of artwork.

CRAFTWORK & CARDS: (Prices per item, per artist should be clearly displayed).

- Craftworks must include: title, price, artists details and we recommend a gift box/bag or paper bag.
- Greeting cards must include: title, artists details, individual envelopes and cellophane pockets.
- Postcards must include: title, artists details, individual envelopes or paper bags.

Remember to ask yourself: "If it was me buying this item, would I like how it is presented?" Good luck & happy painting & creating! Happy customer = Happy Artist!
